In 2019, I wrote *Loam*, my out-loud wondering and love letter to nature. I hope you enjoy it.

Bea Roberts is a multiaward-winning scriptwriter and lyricist from the West Country. She has written for stage and screen, musical

theatre and family shows showcasing her anarchic sensibility and natural bent towards irreverent, dark comedy.

As well as developing original new comedy and comedy-drama series for TV, Bea is currently under commission with the National Theatre, English Touring Theatre, Theatre Royal Plymouth, the Stephen Joseph Theatre and the Royal Shakespeare Company.



Marcus Romer Director

Marcus is an award-winning director, producer, writer and filmmaker. Since 2008, Marcus has been a pioneer of digital theatre. Most

recently, he produced the cinema broadcast of Graeae Theatre's *Reasons to be Cheerful*. In 2014, he adapted and directed *The Knife That Killed Me*, a new feature film for Universal Pictures which opened at Rome Film Festival.

BEHIND THE SCENES

Hazel McIntosh and Olivia Jamieson are graduating in 2022 from the Theatre School's MA in Performance Design. Here they provide an insight into the inspirations behind the design of Loam. You can catch more of their work at GENERATE, a free exhibition showcasing the work of BOVTS creatives at Bristol's Paintworks between 5 – 7 July.

Costume & Projection Designer Hazel McIntosh

What did you look to for inspiration for each individual costume?

We wanted to create a world of heightened contrast. The clinical world of testing and interrogating nature, much of which we've seen in the pandemic, is represented in a world of hazmat-suited performers. Characters' costumes are intense bright colours that stand out against the white sleek look of the set. The intensity of the costumes brings out the life and joy of this play; as well as reflecting a facade of materialism that our characters hide behind before embracing nature (quite literally at times).

Which costume has been the most fun to design?

The woodlouse has been an absolute joy to design and a wonderful project to work on with makers, Ruth and Izzy. It's not every day that you get to design an eccentric rockin' woodlouse.

How did your ideas develop in collaboration with other students?

Working closely with Olivia has been an amazing process. Together we find a great way to balance what we want to bring to the show in response to the text as well as, making the process fun and joyous. I've also really appreciated the costume supervisor's extensive knowledge of the textile world and her dedication to the project.



What have you personally achieved from this production?

I've been able to blend the skill of designing a costume which is also part prop or part set. It's been educational to delve into the world of special effects and materials. It's impacted how I see the relationship between set as costume or costumes as set as an exciting

avenue to explore further.








Set Designer Olivia Jamieson

What did you look to for inspiration?

Various aspects of the growing climate emergency provided inspiration when I first started working on this show, from society's complex and changing relationship to the environment, to the way we are losing touch with nature, and consequently, ourselves. I wanted to create a visual world which expressed this; the sleek corporate linear structure downstage - a metaphor for the out-of-touch world ignoring the looming foreshadowing of the climate crisis, exemplified in the green drops.

How have your ideas developed in collaboration?

This creative process has been enormously collaborative, stretching across numerous departments. As the set designer, I've worked closely with Hazel to create a unified world where the colourful bright costumes sing, in juxtaposition to the sleekness of the set. A personal highlight for me was designing and creating plants that personified the play's soundscape. These were designed and created closely with prop maker Izzy Keating, whose beautiful creations you'll be able to see in the show!



Is there anything you need to consider when designing the set for a show which is being played in rep?

Matthew Cassar (the designer of Catastrophe *Bay*) and I are neighbours in the design studio, where our desks sit side by side. We've both witnessed the birth and creative process of each other's designs coming to life - which has been a joy, particularly because of the contrasting nature of both plays. This mutual creativity has made practical decisions easier when considering shared floor, masking and balancing flying space.





What learning have you valued most at BOVTS?

Personally, the collaborative nature of being a visual storyteller in a supportive and generous environment. And ultimately, working with other likeminded young people to achieve the same shared vision and the lifelong friendships that have flourished in our time here.
